Ursuline Legacy Park

The Ursuline Legacy Park is set to open Spring 2025. This park will honor the Ursuline Sisters of Paola who founded Lakemary

Center. Kirk Davis, President/CEO of Lakemary, had the idea to create this park on our 32 acre campus in Paola. A committee led by Josh Patterson, Director of Information Technology, was formed to see how we could bring this park to life and see Kirk's vision come to fruition. Many meetings later, and one that included a visit with two of the Ursuline Sisters, the park is on pace to open phase one in the Spring.

"Having a chance to meet with the sisters was an incredible experience" says Josh. "The stories they had about the history of the organization and the care they provided throughout their time here just reinforces why this park is so important to honor the legacy they left for us." We are excited about the development of Ursuline Legacy Park.

Recreation and Wellness

Lakemary has stayed consistently busy finding ways to level up the care that we provide. Whether it is to improve our facilities for those we support or programs for our staff, we always strive to look for ways to improve our organization. We are excited to announce a new initiative, Lakemary's Recreation and Wellness Program.



The Kirk Davis Center, our new Psychiatric Residential Treatment Facility for children opened in March 2024, completing phase one of our A Blueprint for Hope Capital Campaign. Phase two is constructing inclusive playgrounds and other recreational opportunities. The new Recreation and Wellness effort for both our children and adult programs will benefit from the new additions to our Paola campus. Shawn Ming, our Recreation

and Aquatics Manager, has identified the layouts of two new inclusive playgrounds. "Having the ability to go outside and participate in activities is such a critical part of everyone's overall wellness and we firmly believe the individuals we support deserve the same opportunity" says Shawn Ming. "With that comes the need to make sure everything we provide for them is equipped to be accessible and beneficial for them and that is where the need for inclusive playgrounds is." The proceeds from Boots & Bowties 2024 and the 40th Annual Lakemary Golf Classic in October will be going directly towards this project to bring safe, high-quality equipment to Lakemary for the children and adults to enjoy!



This also helps the students feel more comfortable while discussing difficult topics such as trauma or grief and loss.
